There are many different types of <u>feelings</u> that have an influence on how we live and interact with others. Of all the different types of emotions, <u>contentment</u> and <u>joy</u> tend to be the one that people <u>desire</u> and <u>cherish</u> the most. For example, pop culture influences tend to <u>focus on</u> attaining <u>agreeable</u> things many <u>value</u>, such as buying a home or having a well-paid job, will result in being <u>happy</u>, <u>cheerful</u> and <u>pleased</u>. And on the contrary, being <u>criticised</u>, <u>heartbroken</u>, <u>stressed</u>, <u>vulnerable</u>, <u>worried</u>, <u>depressed</u>, <u>offended</u>, <u>exhausted</u>, <u>disappointed</u>, <u>frightened</u>, <u>miserable</u>, <u>sick</u>, and <u>lonely</u>, for example, is linked to <u>unpleasant</u> and even <u>harmful</u> things such as <u>lack</u> of <u>judgment coolness</u>, lowered immunity, increased inflammation, and decreased life expectancy.





The <u>environment</u> plays a <u>crucial</u> role in the sustainability of life as we know it here on Earth. 



In order to <u>shrink</u> the <u>generation gap</u>, we must be <u>open-minded</u> about learning from other generations. For example, we should be <u>hyper-aware</u> of how <u>life-transforming</u> a good relationship with a grandparent can be. It offers so much more than <u>treats</u>, <u>precious</u> extra <u>quality</u> time and cheap <u>nannying</u>. It can give a <u>powerful boost</u> of <u>confidence</u> and a <u>meaningful sense</u> of <u>perspective</u>, help to build <u>psychological security</u> and profound <u>moral values</u> by making younger generation feel part of a much wider, diverse and <u>stable supportive</u> family <u>network</u>. Sometimes it's possible to help people <u>heal emotionally</u> by simply <u>reawakening</u> an <u>overflowing cherished</u> memory of a much happier and more <u>unconditionally</u> loving relationship with a <u>doting</u> grandparent. So instead of focusing on the <u>weaknesses</u> of different generations we should recognise their <u>virtues</u> and see the good in each generation.





All <u>criminal cases</u> start in a <u>magistrates' court</u>. It normally deals with minor offences such as juvenile crime, traffic violation (including roadhogs, driving whilst uninsured, with faulty brakes or bald tyres), petty theft, fraud, embezzlement, mugging, shoplifting, jaywalking, loitering with intent, illegal gambling, littering, vandalism, trespassing, and even slander or libel. The more serious offences (such as assault, domestic violence, murder, manslaughter, robbery) are passed on to the Crown Court, either for sentencing after the defendant has been found guilty in a magistrates' court, or for full trial with a judge, jurors, constables, a prosecutor and barrister, and probation officers. 43 If the criminal case is to be dealt within a magistrates' court, the defendants are asked to enter a plea. If they plead guilty, taking the blame, the magistrates can impose a sentence of up to six months' imprisonment for a single offence. If found not guilty, defendants are judged innocent and will be free to go. In some cases, the magistrates' court will decide if you should be kept in custody until your next court hearing, or released on bail and never on parole. The ability of magistrates' courts to imprison or fine defendants is limited. The common penalty is revocation of a privilege, that is a document like driver's licence or hunting permit. You may also get a community sentence if you're convicted of a crime by a court but are not sent to prison. Community sentences combine rehabilitation with activities carried out in the community aimed at doing their bit, such as unpaid work to remove graffiti or clear up litter, getting treatment for drug addiction or keeping to a curfew. This is not a soft option – offenders can be made to do between 40 and 300 hours of demanding work. If you disagree with verdict of the magistrates' court, you may be able to appeal.
